

Here is the delicious recipe for the **Lemon Slice** that Margery brought to the Social Paddle.

### **Ingredients**

250 g sweet plain biscuits  
125 g butter melted  
3/4 cup coconut  
1/2 can condensed milk  
1 lemon zested

### **Icing**

2 cups icing sugar  
1 1/2 tbs butter melted  
1/4 cup lemon juice \*to taste

### **Method**

STEP 1 - Crush biscuits and mix in coconut.  
STEP 2 - Add finely grated lemon rind and mix.  
STEP 3 - Combine melted butter and condensed milk and add to dry mixture. Stir well.  
STEP 4 - Press into a lined slice tin and set in fridge.  
STEP 5 - Icing: Mix all icing ingredients (with lemon juice to taste) and ice when cooled.

## Boat Blessing – 13<sup>th</sup> November

It was a very special day, on Wednesday 13 November, for the Redcliffe Red Dragons Dragon Boat Club and the Redcliffe Pink Snapdragons Breast Cancer Dragon Boat Club, with the traditional Buddhist blessing and ‘awakening of the dragon’ of their new dragon boats. This moving ceremony was led by the Venerable Chueh Tang and Venerable Miao Xin and involved prayers, offering of incense, blessing with holy water and dotting the eyes of the dragons with red paint to awaken them and give them sight.

In Asian culture the blessing and Awakening Ceremony is about respecting the dragon and getting him into a good and friendly mood towards you, the team, and the community. The ritual serves to ward off evil and to sanctify and bless the boats. It is to make our dragon boats strong and fierce and therefore fit to compete in races. It is considered bad luck to race in a dragon boat that has not been properly awakened.

Both clubs are grateful to the Queensland Government who provided \$13,000 to the Red Dragons and \$7,500 to the Pink Snapdragons to purchase the new dragon boats to enable Queenslanders to participate in sport and recreation activities.

Despite the windy and smoky conditions, the ceremony was conducted without a hitch. Both boats were then taken for a paddle in the Newport waters to truly launch them.
