Members Recipes

Margery's delicious White Chocolate, Macadamia & Raspberry Slice recipe that she brought for morning tea.

165g butter, softened

2/3 cup(150g) caster sugar

2/3 cup(150g) brown sugar

2 eggs

2 cups(300g) plain flour

½ tsp baking powder

2 tbs milk

200g frozen raspberries

200g white chocolate coarsely chopped

½ cup (70g) coarsely chopped toasted macadamias.

Pre heat oven to 180C. Grease and line the base and sides of a 16cm x 26cm slice pan with baking paper. Beat the butter and sugar until pale and creamy.

Add eggs one at a time beating well.

Add flour and baking powder and stir to combine.

Stir in the milk.

Add raspberries, white chocolate and macadamias.

Spread into prepared pan. Bake for 35 – 40 minutes or until inserted skewer is clear

IBCPC's New Zealand Regatta Update
